I feel that we have had a wonderful response to the "A Place of Our Own" fund raising. As of this writing, we have in gifts and pledges, over \$80,000.00 toward the goal of \$100,000.00 including, believe it or not, a gift from a member of another Presbyterian Church in **our** Presbytery.

Joyce and I had the "fun" of flying north to Browns Valley (North of Sacramento and East of Marysville) to see our seven grandkids (and, of course, their parents) Dec. 29-31 returning home in time to celebrate New Year's Eve and then to watch the Penn/USC game on New Year's Day.


THE ART OF GOD AT WORK

Just before graduating from Seminary, Dan Bogre received visits by denominational representatives across the country. Each one gave him a list of about 20 types of ministry from which to choose.

Interestingly, Bogre checked every box placed before him. "I thought to myself that I wasn't going to be pigeonholed by a survey for," he said. At the time, Bogre thought he could do any style of ministry.

Later, as an ordained pastor, Bogre began to realize that God had a specific ministry for him. However able he was to do several different types of ministry, he began to understand he was best suited for helping a church grow.

How many boxes <u>would you</u> check? How many ways are you willing to try to help your church and community? Sometimes checking a box outside your "comfort zone" can lead to unexpected but rewarding new paths.



THE GOOD OLD DAYS

Robert Burns, the Scottish poet, compiled a poem in 1788 that has been called the World's Anthem. "Auld Lang Syne" is sung worldwide on New Year's Eve.

The words are in the old Scottish dialect, and are quite meaningful when translated into today's language. They speak about lasting friendship and what we might call "the good old days," As we gather with Christian friends in a home or church, the works are relevant and bonding. Here are two verses loosely translated for today.

Should auld acquaintance be forgot? (Should good old days be forgotten?) And never brought to mind? (And never be remembered?) Should auld acquaintance be forgot? (Should old friends be forgotten?) And auld lang syne? (And days of long ago?)

For auld lang syne, my dear, (For good old days, dear friend,)
For auld land syne, (For days of long ago,)
We'll take of cup o'kindness yet, (We'll drink a cup of kindness now,)
For auld lang syne.
(For the sake of the good old days.)






Women's Bible Study on the Gospel According to Luke led by Elder Joyce Johnson 9:30 am to 11:00 am on Tuesdays

OUR GREAT COOKS

From Susan McGuire's Kitchen

CHEWY CHERRY ALMOND BARS

Ingredients:

1 c butter, softened
2 c all-purpose flour
2 c packed brown sugar
2 c regular rolled oats
1/2 c sliced almonds

1 egg 1 12-ounce jar cherry preserves

1 tsp almond extract (1 cup)

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 deg. Line a 13x9x2 inch baking pan with foil, extending foil over the edges of the pan. Grease foil; set pan aside.
- 2. In a large bowl, beat butter with an electric mixer on medium to high speed for 30 seconds. Add brown sugar and baking powder. Beat until combined, scraping bowl occasionally. Beat in egg and almond extract until combined. Beat in as much of the flour as you can with the mixer. Using a wooden spoon, stir in any remaining flour, the rolled oats, and almonds.
- 3. Remove 1/2 cup of the dough and set aside. Press the remaining dough evenly into the bottom of the prepare baking pan. Spread with preserves. Crumble the remaining dough evenly over preserves layer.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven about 35 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool completely in pan on a wire rack. Using the edges of the foil, lift the uncut cookies out of the pan. Cut into bars. Makes 36 bars.

TO STORE: Place bars in an airtight container; cover. Store in the refrigerator for up to 3 days or freeze for up to 1 month.
