"OctoberFest!"



Our time away has come to an end with a trip to Tucson for Joyce's last surviving aunt's 90th birthday, and then our time in Carlsbad for a bit of "beach" time. Frankly, it is good to have all those junkets completed despite the good times we had, to be back home. And now, it is time to begin anticipating the return of our Winter Residents (aka Snowbirds) as they make their way back here knowing that the 100 + deg. weather is past, that the snow and ice are about to invade their summer homes turning them into teeth-chattering ice cubes; frankly, there is no place on earth like Palm Springs!

With October comes the fall and an increase in activities and winter is not far behind. Germans celebrate "Oktoberfest" which is a wonderful fall time of harvest and all the goodies that go with fall. We in Palm Springs Presbyterian will have so much to celebrate: Thanksgiving, of course, Advent, Christmas, the New Year 2010, and so many other wonderful events. Several things are being planned that will happen:

- 1.) An all church "workday" on a Saturday in late October (maybe October 24 from 10 am to 12 noon) with refreshments so that we can tidy up for the fall dusting, sweeping, oiling wood, putting pots and pans away in the new kitchen, pulling any weeds, fixing the fountain, maybe even planting a few fall/winter flowers and maybe, just maybe, Pastor Bill will help prune the rose bushes (he will bring his own pruning shears and also some "Miracle Grow" to help.) So, watch for details and bring work gloves, Windex, paper towels, hoes, shears, etc., etc.
- 2.) Our regular **Welcome Back Bar-B-Q** that we have so enjoyed over the years with Harvey Stephens and friends cooking and serving welcoming all of us and, hopefully, some from our neighborhood, which is scheduled for Sunday, November 8th immediately following worship.
- **3.)** A **Disaster Preparation Seminar f**or a date yet to be determined. It would either be on a Sunday afternoon or evening for all of us and any in the neighborhood who would care to attend helping to prepare us for any possible disaster that might/may/will happen in the future, eg. Earthquake, fires, 1000-year flood, airplane crash, etc.
- **4.)** A Saturday morning (November 28th from 9:30 am to 12 noon) the Saturday before Advent begins for a "**Hangin**' o' the Greens" celebration/party in preparation for Advent and Christmas: a 9' tall Christmas tree with lights; the Advent Wreath set up; other wreaths and swags hung; glistening lights strung inside and outside the church to herald the birth of Jesus and to welcome the neighborhood, and, of course, refreshments and singing of Christmas carols, hymns and songs. More details to come.
- **5.) Big Question:** Would you like and participate in **a Christmas Eve Service?** Now that we have "A Place of our Own" is a good time to get back to celebrating the birth of Jesus on Christmas Eve. Let Pastor Bill or a Session member know and, if you have a preference, what time of the evening would work best for you. On concluding the service we will gather on the front steps and sing "Silent Night," and/or "O Come, All Ye Faithful," etc., and the bells in our tower will ring out the good news to the neighborhood!
- **6.)** We seriously need ASAP a 26" to 26" flat screen TV either with DVD capability or a separate DVD player attached in anticipation for any **Sunday School** that we hopefully, will have this fall and for use at our "5:59 **Gatherings.**" Cost: somewhere between \$400 to \$600 at places like Costco. Please see Pastor Bill if you can help with this. Two or three people, or more, could make this happen easily.

7.) Last, but certainly no least, **Choir Members.** Alex and the Praise Singers would love to have more singers; we have a choir that truly makes a *joyful noise unto the Lord*, but more voices would praise God even more. Please speak to Geri, Alex, or to any choir member. Rehearsals are on Thursdays at 4:00 pm in the church sanctuary and then again on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am before worship.

Finally, we all need to do these things together and we need to invite and bring others to experience the love and friendship of PSPC and to help them grow in the Grace and Knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. I don't think anyone of us will disagree with this!

And yes, there are so many for whom I am deeply appreciative and who make me look good: all the members of the Kitchen Committee: Margaret Pace, Jackie Morgan, Jan Perrier, Barbara Stephens, Jim DeHart and Donna McCullen. The kitchen is looking fantastic thanks to their vision. From Dorothy Hollerback's Kitchen Pineapple Carrot Cake

- 2 c flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 1/2 tsp soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- 1 1/2 c cooking oil (I use Mazola)
- 2 c sugar
- 4 eggs
- 2 c grated carrots (use large grate)
- 1 can (61/2-7 oz.) crushed pineapple
- 1/2 to 3/4 c chopped walnuts

Sift all dry ingredients together and set aside. Mix oil, sugar and eggs, beating after each addition. Add dry ingredients and mix well. Add carrots, pineapple and nuts. Grease and flour on 9' x 13' rectangular pan or comparable size). Bake cake 30-35 minutes at 325 deg. (CHECK for doneness)

If baking this in a Pyrex dish, reduce heat 25 degrees.

ICING:

- 18 oz pkg. Cream cheese
- 1 stick butter
- 1 box sifted confectioners' sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 c coconut

Slivered almonds (with skins on-they are the prettiest)

Mix first four ingredients. Add coconut. Frost cake and sprinkle generously with slivered almonds.

Keep in cool room or in the refrigerator if not consumed in two days.
