### Pastor Bill's "Nano-November "

(II Timothy 4:6-8 nrsv)



Where is this year going? My goodness, only two months to go in 2010. By the time you get this **Sonshine** the mid-term elections will be history and we will be moving one direction or another. No matter for whom you voted or how you voted on the various propositions, the central issue of us, as Christians, is that we continue to 1) pray for our nation and our elected representatives; 2) that we remain in contact with our elected representatives letting them know what we think and how we feel; and 3) understand that the so-called "separation of church and state" (which is not in the Constitution!) means that the state will not impose a religion on us! It does not mean that the church and/or Christians can not speak to political issues. We can and we must!

With the last Sunday of this month (November 28) we begin Advent - the four Sundays leading up to Christmas: preparing for the Birthday of our Lord Jesus, probably one of the most beautiful seasons of the Church year. With all the pressures around us to be PC (politically correct); all our fears and concerns (right or wrong) about Islam and the growing Islamaphobia in our country; and with serious questions about our national economy, increasing concerns about undocumented immigrants (aka illegal immigrants), world-wide threats of terrorism, and worries about health and health-care; concerns about our finances and our security; what are our priorities during Advent?

For me the number one priority is to worship and celebrate the coming of the

"Wonderful Counselor, the Mighty God, ... the Prince of Peace" Isaiah 9:6b nrsv into our midst; into the midst of all creation. One thing no other world religion does and that is to celebrate that God is in our midst. So, my friends, let's celebrate!

The Christmas tree will be going up as will lots of our Christmas decorations; our church will be lovely (it is anyway!) in a very special way; and it is a very beautiful time to bring new people and to greet our first, second, and third time guests. Session will be appointing a committee to do the decorating and their plans, decision, and execution will be **final!** If you have suggestions speak to me or to Jim DeHart, Clerk of Session, and those suggestions will be passed on to the committee in charge.

Oh, yes, I almost forgot, and then there is *Thanksgiving* on Thursday, Nov. 25th. As you sit down with family and loved ones, or even by yourself, take time to think of all the blessings God has given you and do one thing: *Thank God for those blessings!* 

I am still convinced that God has a great future ahead of us.

I firmly believe....

God has a great future for us: a resurrection of sorts which is happening.

But you and I have to do our parts! I'm trying. Are you?

How you and I respond will determine the results of God's future for PSPC.

### **Session Notes**

The Session met on Thursday, October 28th at 9:30 a.m. Three members of Session were excused for health reasons. Elder Ann Smith from Committee on Ministry was our guest. Pastor Bill opened talking about "who we are, where are we going? and how are we getting there?" as a church and as a Session and reading from Matthew 28 and Ephesians 4. Session then prayed for those mentioned and for the life of the church.

Elder Ann Smith talked with the Session about the progress of the Pastor Nominating Committee in seeking and finding an installed pastor and what are Pastor Bill's plans. Pastor Bill assured the Session that he will not "pull the rug" out from under PSPC before they find a called/installed pastor but, when the PNC is ready, he will retire allowing some time between his leaving and the new person's coming.

Session decided to support the Christmas Joy Offering in December and the Heifer Project. Session was reminded that on a per capita basis PSPC is the most generous giving church in this Presbytery for special mission giving.

Session also decided to have our Stewardship "Campaign" for 2011 from mid-January to mid-February, 2011 so that our Winter Residents can participate. More details to come.

Session approved the Women's Retreat for April 2, 2011 and a Christmas Tea on Saturday, December 4th for the retreat, and a Bake Sale on Feb. 13th.

Session approved inviting a Disaster Preparedness Presentation during the Winter, 2011 to be available to all, including the Winter Residents and the neighborhood.

The Worship Committee recommended, and Session approved, a Christmas Eve service at 7:00p.m. including Communion and that Communion be served while seated in our pews beginning in November, 2010 through June 2011

The Finance Committee reported on PSPC's finances through September and the Session, recognizing that we still have a way to go, was pleased with the support we are receiving and the relatively good condition PSPC is in at the end of the 3rd quarter, September, 2010

Appreciation was expressed to those from the congregation and our Winter Residents for their support and generosity with the letter sent this summer about finances from Pastor Bill.

Session was also appraised about the new A/C costing \$7,500.00 that was installed early summer and that in fact, that we were able to pay for it from the Building Fund. Appreciation was also expressed to the General A/C, our A/C maintenance provider, for reducing the price by 25% since we are a church

Reports were received from the various committees including Nominating, Christian Education, Membership (we have a new member class of at least 6 or more coming in soon), the Clerk of Session, and the Deacons.

The next Presbytery meeting will be at St. Andrews Presbyterian Church, Indio, from 10:00a.m (9:00a.m. for breakfast) to 1:00 p.m. being represented by Elders Bob Wulf and Jackie Morgan, also attending will be Geri Bintliff and Margaret Pace as observers.

Next scheduled meeting will be Wednesday, November 17th at 9:30 a.m. The next Session meeting will be on Wednesday, Nov. 17th at 9:30a.m.



## Now that the cooler weather is with us, we'll continue with the soup recipes from Souper Bowl Sunday

### From Jackie Morgan's Kitchen Vegetable Beef Soup

#### Step 1

2 lbs. beef shank or short ribs 2 celery stalks, chopped cups diced tomatoes

1 onion, chopped salt

2 carrots, chopped 1 bay leaf

Combine ingredients in crock cooker and cook at low for 12 hours. Remove beef from soup and trim meat from bones, return meat to soup and refrigerate overnight so the fat can congeal and be easily removed.

#### Step 2

Add your favorite vegetables to the defatted meat broth and cook till the vegetables are tender. I like to use peas, corn, and green beans. Adjust the salt if necessary. One of the best parts of this soup is that the vegetables are so colorful. It makes the soup pretty.
