Message from Rev. Christine

"Awake, my soul! Awake, harp and lyre! I will awaken the dawn." Psalm 57:8

I have never been an early riser, unless it was to be the first to reach the single heat vent in the small house where I was raised. There were four of us, so getting the inside spot could be pretty meaningful on a cold February morning. But this is a brand new day, and unusual behavior is afoot! Clearly, we don't need to rush to heater vents very often in Palm Springs! So, imagine my surprise when I started waking up at five-thirty a.m.. Not just woke up, but got up. I couldn't help myself, because of the light that threw itself, like the fire of heaven, across the wall. After that first morning, I don't miss a sunrise if I can help it.

There is something about desert mornings that touches the deepest part of a person: they're mysterious, and spiritual. Maybe it's the way the hills and mountains turn from one color to the next, standing out in bold relief against each other or jet trails that become pink, then yellow, then back to white. It could even be how light hits the grass on a golf course, still damp from sprinklers or dew, depending on the season. Birds love the mornings, as do bunnies – tons of bunnies! Overall, there is a sense of peace and beginnings. The desire of the Psalmist to announce the new day becomes the desire of everyone who witnesses such beauty, and, yes, occasionally I will participate, although usually without a harp and most usually with strains from a Rodgers and Hammerstein musical like, 'Oh What a Beautiful Morning!'

I often think about our little church, too, and each person who sits in a pew on a Sunday or sings in the choir or participates in one of our communal meals or does any number of what there is to do in a church. This includes all of you far away for the summer, by the way! We have a unique and wonderful church family, and I have no doubt that our presence in our community will grow in the coming months and years.

This is a good time, as our busy lives slow to the pace of summer, to consider our dreams for Palm Springs Presbyterian Church. I encourage each of you to spend some time in meditation and prayer, letting yourself be led by the Spirit as you consider what God's future plans for the PSPC family might look like. This does not mean discarding past tradition of meaning and mission, as the work of the faithful souls of PSPC is the foundation for what is to come; it is more like a re-imagining. It is very much like the early dawn hours, leading us into a day filled with possibility. Who are we as Christ's people, in this place? How can we best serve in this time, and how can we best welcome? Where might each of our gifts be helpful?

There is such joy in God's creation, and it can only be multiplied by our demonstrating this love through word and deed. As the days of summer unfold, all that PSPC has accomplished in Christ will continue to be celebrated, and all that we will accomplish in His name will be anticipated! Happy summertime, everyone!

I offer these words from General Assembly: "This decision begins with the unequivocal affirmation that ordained office will continue to be rooted in each deacon, elder and minister's 'joyful submission to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life.'"

This decision confirms the authority of tenets found in our Book of Confession and returns our church to it's roots – The Living Word, a single body with many gifts, called to service, with Christ as it's head.

Palm Springs Presbyterian is a church of "open hearts and open minds", and our focus on God's generous love is a great strength. Session met on Wednesday, June 15, 2011 at 9:35 a.m. Elder Geri Bintliff presented the devotional from a "Collection of Gifts" by Helen Rice and Isaiah 40, 26-31 followed with prayer. All members were present with Elders Bob Wulf & Harry Henderson being excused. Deacon Robert Kemp was present representing the Deacons.

Session approved changing our website address to "pspresby.org" which will be more recognizable, the purchase of 4 earphones for the hearing impaired and having an Elders Retreat in the early fall. Session approved George Cebra, base player, as a regular in the Praise Band. The Treasurer's report showed a loss for the month of May of \$3,087 compared to a profit of \$698 in May of 2010 and a year to date thru May a loss of \$7,050 compared to a YTD profit of \$1,290 for 2010. A motion was approved to adopt an abbreviated model on sexual misconduct for leadership.

Session was adjourned at 11:45 a.m. with prayer. The next Session meeting is Wednesday, July 20, 2011 in the Fellowship Hall of the church.
