From Pastor Christine,

These may seem like odd words to share on the eve of our annual 'season of renewal,' on the front porch, so to speak, of the inspiration and energy that accompanies the return of our seasonal congregants! So why, you might ask, would one write of being 'poor and needy' and calling out for deliverance and help?

Session met on Wednesday, July 18, 2012 at 9:32 a.m. Pastor Christine opened with prayer followed by Elder Ernie Moore reviewing a chronological table on understanding the various influences that the Greeks encountered from 158 B.C. thru 1945. All members were present with Elder Susan McGuire being excused.

Session approved Robert Tryce's request for transfer of membership to the Valley Presbyterian Church in Portola Valley, CA and acknowledged the death of Charles Walker, an affiliate member, on July 3, 2012.

Session approved the following:

- Presbytery's request for Pastor Christine to preach in Temecula on July 22nd and Rev. Narcissis Tucker as replacement in our church.
- Setting up an account with Simple Give for processing donations and tithes thru our internet website (www.pspresby.org).
- An agreement with Lifetouch photography (formally Olin Mills) for a photo directory with pictures being taken in February.
- Cathedral City Community Presbyterian Church's request for them to hold their Session Retreat at our church to be on Saturdays September 22nd and October 27th.
- For Pastor Christine to conduct the baptism of Everett William Ivan, great grandson of Harvey & Barbara Stephens.

Session voted against participation of Rev. Christine on a Presbytery hosted mission trip to El Salvador for one week in September.

Pastor Christine informed Session that Bob Barrett would be our representative from the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery replacing Anne Smith who's term had expired. As a member of the Committee on Ministry, Pastor Christine has been appointed representative to the Palm Desert Community Presbyterian Church and also the Spirit of the Desert Fellowship.

Deacon's sent flowers on behalf of the church to the family of Charles Walker upon his passing on July 3rd and purchased bus passes for a member of our church family.

The Treasurer's report showed a **loss** for the month of June of **\$4,284** and a **loss** year to date as of June 30th of **\$150**. In July, in response to the Summer Appeal's letter, \$3,875 has been received. During July, Pavers were installed at the gate for better access for disabled and palm trees were trimmed and skinned. The new Nominating Committee has been meeting to select replacements for the Session. Christian Education now has 4 on the committee and Congregational Life now has 6 members.

Session was adjourned at 11:00 AM with prayer. The next Session will be on September 19th at 9:30 AM.

Pecan Pie Graham Cracker Chewy Bars

Crust: 3 C graham cracker crumbs

1 1/2 sticks butter at room temp

¼ C sugar 2 T flour

Heat the oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl with an electric mixer or in the bowl of a stand mixer, beat the graham cracker crumbs, butter, sugar and flour until moist and well-blended. Press the mixture firmly and evenly over the bottom of a 13" x 9" baking pan. Bake until the curst is golden brown, 10 to 15 min.

Topping and Assembly:

2 ½ C brown sugar

4 extra-large eggs

2/3 C graham cracker crumbs

1 T vanilla

¾ t salt

½ t baking powder

1 C pecans, chopped

1 prepared crust


powdered sugar, if desired

- 1. While the curst is baking, in a large bowl, whisk together the brown sugar and eggs to blend. Whisk in the graham cracker crumbs, vanilla, salt and baking powder until wellblended. Stir in the pecans.
- 2. Spread the mixture over the baked crust and return to the 350 degree oven until the filling is dark-golden on top and jiggles slightly when tapped, 20 to 25 minutes. Transfer the pan to a cooling rack and cool completely.
- 3. Sprinkle a light coating of sifted powdered sugar over the pan if desired, and cut into 24 bars. The bars can be made 1 day in advance. Wrap in plastic and keep at room temperature.
